



Reader's Pro-Liturgy Typica Service (Obednitsa) for Sunday

If we cannot make it to church for Divine Liturgy, we read this service in place of the Divine Liturgy at home. Those praying should gather in a clean, dedicated area (the icon corner, or dining room with a white cloth over the table), light a lamp or candle, venerate the Gospel (or Bible,) Cross, and icons of our Lord and his Mother, and begin the prayers thus:

Presiding Reader (often the head of the household): Through the prayers of our holy fathers,
O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us and save us.

Reader: Amen.

Glory to Thee, our God, glory to Thee.

O Heavenly King, the Comforter, the Spirit of Truth,
who art everywhere present and fillest all things;
Treasury of Blessings, and Giver of Life;
come and abide in us, and cleanse us from every impurity,
and save our souls, O Good One.

Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us. (*Thrice*)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;
now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

O Most Holy Trinity, have mercy on us.

O Lord, cleanse us from our sins.

O Master, pardon our transgressions.

O Holy One, visit and heal our infirmities, for Thy name's sake.

Lord, have mercy. (*Thrice*)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;
now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be Thy name.

Thy Kingdom come.

<p>Tone 3: Let the heavens rejoice; let the earth be glad; for the Lord has shown strength with His arm: He has trampled down death by death; He has become the first born of the dead; He has delivered us from the depths of hell, and has granted the world great mercy.</p>	<p>Tone 4: When the women disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the joyous message of thy Resurrection, they cast away the ancestral curse and elatedly told the apostles: 'Death is overthrown! Christ God is risen, granting the world great mercy.'</p>
<p>Tone 5: Let us, the faithful, praise and worship the Word, co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit, born for our salvation from the Virgin; for He willed to be lifted up on the Cross in the flesh, to endure death, and to raise the dead by His glorious Resurrection.</p>	<p>Tone 6: The angelic powers were at Thy tomb; the guards became as dead men. Mary stood by Thy grave, seeking Thy most pure body. Thou didst capture hell not being tempted by it. Thou didst come to the Virgin, granting life. O Lord, who didst rise from the dead, glory to Thee.</p>
<p>Tone 7: By Thy Cross Thou didst destroy death, to the thief Thou didst open Paradise, for the Myrrhbearers Thou didst change weeping into joy, and Thou didst command Thy disciples, O Christ God, to proclaim that Thou art risen, granting the world great mercy.</p>	<p>Tone 8: Thou didst descend from on high, O Merciful One; Thou didst accept the three day burial to free us from our sufferings. O Lord, our Life and Resurrection, glory to Thee.</p>

The Creed (Symbol of the Faith)

With its twelve articles.

1. I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven and Earth and of all things visible and invisible.

2. And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the only-begotten, begotten of the Father before all ages. Light of light; true God of true God; begotten, not made; of one essence with the Father, by whom all things were made;

3. Who for us men and for our salvation came down from Heaven, and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became man.

4. And He was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate, and suffered, and was buried.

5. And the third day He arose again, according to the Scriptures,

6. And ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father;

7. And He shall come again with glory to judge the living and the dead; whose Kingdom shall have no end.

8. And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of Life, who proceeds from the Father; who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; who spoke by the prophets.

9. In one Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church.

10. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins.

11. I look for the resurrection of the dead

12. and the life of the world [*or: age*] to come. Amen.

Act of Contrition

Reader: Loose, remit, and pardon, O God, our sins both voluntary and involuntary, in word or in deed, in knowledge or in ignorance, committed by day or by night, of the mind or of the intention: forgive us them all, for Thou art good and lovest mankind.

*On most Sundays throughout the year,
we begin with the Resurrectional Kontakion in the tone of the week:
(see the lectionary wall calendar for the tone)*

Tone 1: As God, Thou didst rise from the tomb in glory, raising the world with Thyself. Human nature praises Thee as God, for death has vanished; Adam exults, O Master; Eve rejoices, for she is freed from bondage, and cries to Thee: 'Thou art the Giver of Resurrection to all, O Christ!'	Tone 2: Hell became afraid, O almighty Savior, seeing the miracle of Thy Resurrection from the tomb. The dead arose; creation, with Adam, beheld this and rejoiced with Thee, and the world, O my Saviour, praises Thee forever.
Tone 3: On this day Thou didst rise from the tomb, O Merciful One, leading us from the gates of death; on this day Adam exults as Eve rejoices; with the Prophets and Patriarchs they unceasingly praise the divine majesty of Thy power.	Tone 4: My Saviour and Redeemer rose from the tomb as God and delivered the earth-born from their chains. He has shattered the gates of hell, and as Master, He has risen on the third day.
Tone 5: Thou didst descend into hell, O my Savior, shattering its gates as Almighty, resurrecting the dead as Creator, and destroying the sting of death. Thou hast delivered Adam from the curse, O Lover of man, and we cry to Thee: O Lord, save us.	Tone 6: When Christ God the Giver of Life, raised all of the dead from the valleys of misery with His mighty hand, He bestowed resurrection on the human race. He is the Savior of all, the Resurrection, the Life, and the God of all.

Tone 7: The dominion of death can no longer hold men captive, for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its powers. Hell is bound, while the Prophets rejoice and cry: 'the Saviour has come to those in faith; enter, ye faithful, into the Resurrection.'

Tone 8: By rising from the tomb, Thou didst raise the dead and resurrect Adam, Eve exults in Thy Resurrection, and the world celebrates Thy rising from the dead, O greatly Merciful One.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Then the kontakion of the saint of the day.

Now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

On most Sundays throughout the year, the Supplicatory Kontakion of the Theotokos:

Steadfast Protectress of Christians, constant advocate before the Creator, despise not the cries of us sinners, but in thy goodness come speedily to help us who call on thee in faith; hasten to hear our petition and to intercede for us, O Theotokos, for thou dost ever protect those who honor thee.

In Place of Holy Communion

Reader: Lord, have mercy. **(40 times)**

O most Holy Trinity, Might one in essence, Kingdom undivided, the Cause of all good, have mercy even on me, a sinner. Confirm and instruct my heart and take away from me every defilement. Enlighten my mind that I may ever glorify, praise, and adore Thee, saying:

One is holy, One is Lord: Jesus Christ, to the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Typica (Monastic) Dismissal

Reader: Blessed be the name of the Lord, henceforth and forevermore. **(Thrice)**

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;
now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Reader: I will bless the Lord at all times,
His praise shall continually be in my mouth.
My soul shall make its boast in the Lord;

Dismissal

Reader: It is truly meet to bless thee, O Theotokos,
ever-blessed and most pure, and the mother of our God.
More honorable than the Cherubim
and more glorious beyond compare than the Seraphim;
without corruption thou gavest birth to God the Word:
True Theotokos, we magnify thee.

Reader: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;
now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Lord, have mercy. (*Thrice*)

O Lord, bless.

Presiding Reader: O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, for the sake of the prayers of Thy Most-Pure Mother, of our holy and God-bearing fathers, of *NN.*, my [our] heavenly patron(s), [of _____, whom we commemorate this day,] and of all the saints, have mercy upon us and save us, for Thou art good and lovest mankind.

Reader/People: Amen.

If desired, for the current health crises, we may add:

O God Almighty, Lord of heaven and earth, and of all creation visible and invisible, in Thine ineffable goodness, look down upon us, Thy people gathered in thy Holy Name. Be our helper and defender in this day of affliction. Thou knowest our weakness. Thou hearest our cry in repentance and contrition of heart. O Lord who lovest mankind, deliver us from the impending threat of the Corona Virus. Send Thine angel to watch over and protect us. Grant health and recovery to those suffering from this virus. Guide the hands of physicians and preserve those who are healthy. Enable us to continue to serve our suffering brothers and sisters in peace that together we may glorify Thy most honorable and majestic name: of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages.
